

- 1) Contact with the local International Relations desk of your University
 - 2) Check all the courses and programs provided by UniCA
 - 3) Apply following your University's guidelines
 - 4) Once both Universities accept your application, let's start the Mobility process !
 - 5) Complete the learning agreement (LA) for the purpose of mobility in relation to the study cycle. This must be supplied with your application
 - 6) MoveON* application form
 - 7) "Before"form (Scholarship & Mobility Kit & Banking Information)
 - 8) Departure ! 
 - 9) "During" form certificate of arrival ; possibility of modification of LA and Banking information
 - 10)"After" form certificate of departure
 - 11)Mandatory Erasmus + mobility-end report to be submitted before leaving
 - 12)Mandatory UniCA Survey after your mobility


