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OPENING CEREMONY OF THE INTERNATIONAL WINTER UNIVERSITY – UNIWIN 2026

International Winter University – UNIWIN 2026 officially commenced with a welcoming ceremony held at the premises of University “Haxhi Zeka” in Peja. The event was opened by Prof. Dr. Armand Krasniqi, Rector of the University; Prof. Dr. Edmond Beqiri, Vice-Rector for International Cooperation; and MSc Arbërorë Haxhija, Director of the Office for International Cooperation. The ceremony was attended by members of the University’s Governing Council, faculty deans, as well as academic and administrative staff, reflecting the institution’s strong commitment to international academic collaboration. University “Haxhi Zeka” welcomed approximately 70 students from various countries, who gathered in Peja to participate in an intensive week of academic activities, cultural exchange, and international networking opportunities. “THE ECO-DIGITAL FUTURE: GREEN TECHNOLOGY, SMART TOURISM, AND SUSTAINABLE INVESTMENTS”

Prof. Ahm Shamsuzzoha & Prof. Fisnik Morina

This course offered a multidisciplinary and cross-sectoral perspective, aiming to equip students with advanced knowledge and skills at the intersection of green technologies, smart tourism, and sustainable investments in the digital era.

In the context of global climate transformations, the digitalization of the tourism industry, and sustainable development priorities, the course provided an integrated approach linking sustainability principles with innovative technological solutions, new environmental governance models, and the potential for green financing.

Upon completion of the course, students will be able to:

- Explain and analyze the fundamental concepts of sustainable development in the context of the digital era.
- Evaluate the potential and impact of green technologies and innovative solutions.
- Apply knowledge of Smart Tourism and the circular economy to design new models for managing visitor experiences and minimizing environmental impact in the tourism sector.
- Analyze the connection between local communities and ecotourism.
- Identify financial instruments and supportive policies for green investments.
- Design and present integrated projects for sustainable tourism, using practical approaches and concrete case studies.
- Critically reflect on current challenges and trends in the industry.

“DESIGN THINKING FOR INNOVATIONS IN TOURISM”

Prof. Kesra Nermend & Prof. Elvis Elezaj

This course introduced students to the Design Thinking methodology—an innovative approach that combines user empathy, interdisciplinary thinking, and rapid prototyping. In the context of tourism, this method served as an effective tool for designing new products and services, creating unique travel experiences, and solving challenges within the sector.

Upon completion of the course, students gained the following knowledge and skills:

- Understand and apply the Design Thinking process in tourism and destination management.
- Identify user needs and define tourism-related problems using a human-centered approach.
- Develop creative and innovative solutions to tourism challenges.
- Work effectively in teams throughout the design and innovation process.
- Utilize rapid prototyping to test and refine ideas in real tourism contexts.

“NEUROFEEDBACK EEG IN TOURISM AND WELLNESS EXPERIENCES”

Prof. Malgorzata Nermend & Prof. Thëllëza Latifi

This course offered an interdisciplinary introduction to EEG-based neurofeedback and its growing applications in tourism, wellness, hospitality, and experience design. Students explored how real-time brain activity measurement and biofeedback can be used to understand travelers' emotions, assess restorative environments, design wellness services, and enhance guest experiences in hotels, spas, retreats, and tourist destinations. The course combined theory, practical demonstrations, interactive workshops, and group project work. No prior knowledge of neuroscience was required.

The course was particularly suitable for students interested in tourism management, wellness and spa studies, travel psychology, experience engineering, hospitality innovation, human-technology interaction, and sustainable tourism.

During the module, students were able to:

- Understand the basic concepts of EEG, brainwave frequencies, and neurofeedback principles.
- Differentiate clinical EEG systems from consumer-grade devices and understand their applications in tourism and wellness.
- Apply neurofeedback concepts in the design and evaluation of tourist experiences and relaxation activities.
- Interpret basic EEG data and identify common artifacts during recordings.
- Analyze the use of EEG in tourism research, including visitor emotions, environmental psychology, and destination branding.
- Collaborate effectively in interdisciplinary and international teams.

“CIRCULAR ECONOMY FOR SUSTAINABLE TOURISM: POLICIES AND DEVELOPMENT PRACTICES”

Prof. Ibrahim Krasniqi & Prof. Viktória Vásáry

This course examined how circular economy (CE) principles can promote sustainable tourism development and contribute to achieving the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). Students explored policies, business models, and practical strategies that improve resource efficiency and reduce environmental impact within the tourism sector. The program included an analysis of global and European Union frameworks—such as the European Green Deal and the Circular Economy Action Plan (CEAP)—and their implications for tourist destinations and enterprises. Through international case studies, students evaluated successful circular tourism initiatives, identified implementation barriers, and developed knowledge for transitioning from linear practices to sustainable, regenerative, and resilient tourism systems.

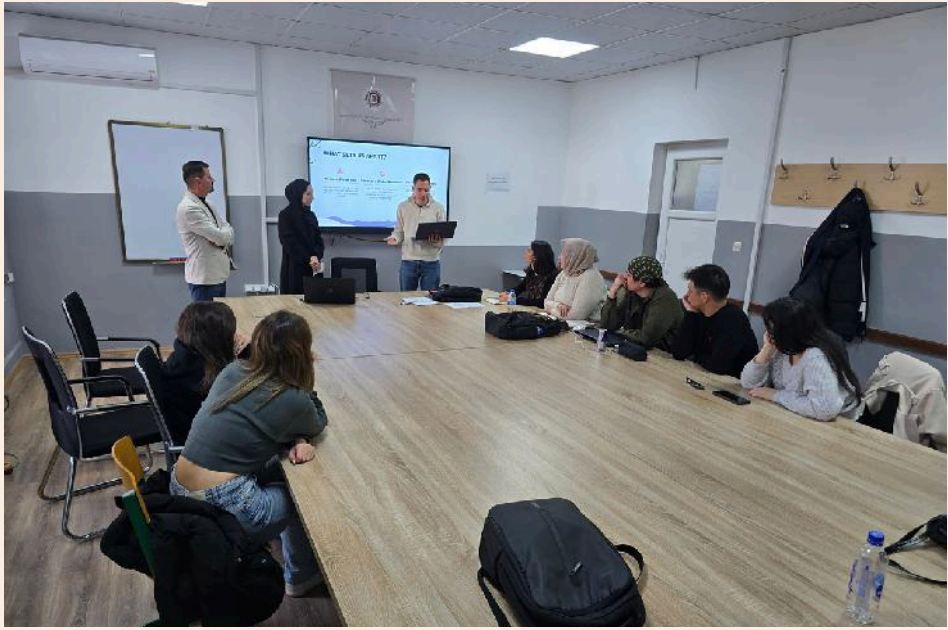
Upon completing this course, students were able to:

- Explain the key concepts and principles of the circular economy and their relevance to sustainable tourism.
- Assess EU policies and global frameworks such as the European Green Deal and CEAP in the tourism sector.
- Analyze successful circular tourism initiatives and innovative business models.
- Evaluate the role of technology, innovation, and digitalization in enabling circular solutions.
- Develop policy recommendations and business strategies that support circular practices and sustainable tourism development.

“TOURISM ECONOMY”

Prof. Jiyan Kiliç & Prof. Driton Sylqa

The Tourism Economy course examines the economic dimensions of tourism by analyzing how tourism activities impact national and regional economies, including their role in growth, development, and sustainability. This course provides students with a foundation in fundamental economic principles and applies them to the structure, functioning, and dynamics of the tourism industry, with a focus on supply, demand, market equilibrium, and well-being concepts.

Learning Outcomes:

- Understand and apply fundamental economic principles within the context of tourism.
- Explain the structure and economic role of the tourism industry.
- Analyze supply, demand, and market equilibrium in tourism.
- Evaluate the impact of prices, income, and economic factors on tourism activity.
- Understand sustainable tourism and its contribution to economic development.
- Apply economic well-being concepts, including consumer and producer surplus, in tourism analysis.
- Critically analyze academic literature in tourism economics.

“SUSTAINABLE AND INNOVATIVE TOURISM, HOSPITALITY, AND CULINARY SERVICES”

Prof. Gjore Nakov & Prof. Merita Dauti Begolli

This course focuses on sustainable and innovative practices in tourism, hospitality, and culinary services. It integrates cultural heritage, gastronomy, hospitality management, entrepreneurship, and digital solutions. The emphasis is on sustainability, innovation, and the development of practical skills, aiming to enhance the tourist experience while respecting cultural and environmental values.

Students acquired competencies to address real-world challenges related to:

- Identifying and evaluating sustainable practices within the tourism, hospitality, and culinary sectors.
- Applying innovative management approaches to improve service quality and competitiveness.
- Integrating cultural heritage and gastronomy into tourism planning and service design.
- Utilizing digital tools to enhance marketing, service delivery, and operational efficiency.

“TRADITION AND INNOVATION: PROF. DR. FATİH SÖNMEZ AT UNIWIN 2026”

Participants of the third edition of UNIWIN 2026 had the opportunity to attend two special lectures by Prof. Dr. Fatih Sönmez, held over the two days of the winter university, providing valuable insights into tourism and local economic development.

1. Health Tourism: Concepts, Opportunities, and Role in Sustainable Development

In this lecture, Prof. Dr. Fatih Sönmez presented the key concepts of health tourism, emphasizing its importance as a sector with significant potential for economic development and innovation. Participants learned about the opportunities offered by health tourism, successful international practices, and ways this sector can contribute to sustainable economic and social development in Kosovo. The lecture provided a platform for discussions on strategies to promote health tourism and integrate it with local and international sectors.

2. Production of Local Value-Added Products from Native Plants

In the second session, Prof. Dr. Fatih Sönmez focused on producing local value-added products, linking traditional knowledge with modern production and entrepreneurship techniques. The lecture showcased concrete examples of products made from native plants and how they can be developed as economically viable products, creating opportunities for local entrepreneurs and strengthening the local community economy. Participants were inspired by the proposed practices and engaged in discussions on innovation and the development of traditional products.

Both sessions sparked great interest and active discussions among students and academic staff, reinforcing the interdisciplinary and international spirit of UNIWIN 2026.

“ERASMUS+ KOSOVO: INFORMATIVE LECTURE FOR UNIWIN 2026 PARTICIPANTS”

Students and academic staff had the opportunity to attend a special lecture delivered by Mimika Dobroshti, representative of the Erasmus+ Office in Kosovo.

During the presentation, Ms. Dobroshti informed participants about the role and mission of the Erasmus+ Office in Kosovo, including:

- Erasmus+ programs and the opportunities they offer for students and higher education institutions.
- Tools for international cooperation and academic mobility.
- The importance of institutional partnerships between Kosovo and European higher education institutions.

The main topic of the lecture was: “Strengthening European–Kosovo Cooperation in Higher Education through Erasmus+,” highlighting how international collaboration and Erasmus+ programs can foster academic and professional development for both students and academic staff.

This session generated significant interest among participants and greatly contributed to the international and interdisciplinary spirit of UNIWIN 2026, enhancing awareness of Erasmus+ as a key instrument for advancing higher education in Kosovo.



“EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT: GUEST LECTURE ON TOURISM IN PEJA – UNIWIN 2026”

As part of UNIWIN 2026, students and academic staff had the opportunity to attend a guest lecture organized by the Tourism Office of the Municipality of Peja on the topic: “Tourism – Potential for Economic Development of Kosovo.” The lecture was delivered by Virtyt Morina, Blerta Harxhi Begolli, and Jakob Hook, who presented to both local and international students and professors the natural and cultural assets of Peja, as well as the institutional vision for its development as an attractive tourist destination. Participants learned about the potential of mountain, cultural, and adventure tourism, opportunities for international cooperation, and the positive impact that tourism development has on the local economy and job creation. This session generated significant interest and active discussions, strengthening the connection between academia and local institutions, while promoting Kosovo and Peja as destinations with extraordinary development and tourism potential.

UNIWIN 2026 continues to serve as an international platform linking academic knowledge with institutional practices, emphasizing tourism as a real opportunity for economic growth and international collaboration.

“Discovering the Rugova Gorge Through the Steps of UNIWIN Students”

As part of the UNIWIN program activities, students participated in a one-day visit to the Rugova Gorge, one of the most renowned natural and cultural destinations in Peja. 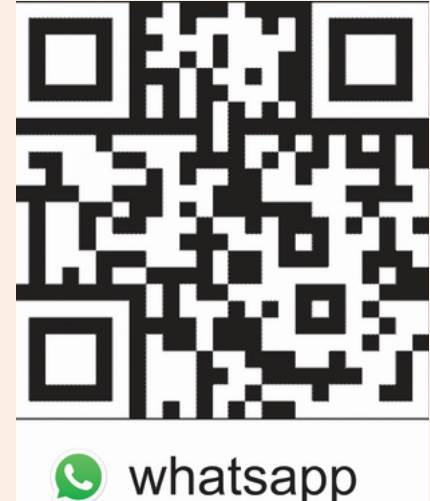
The program also featured invited lectures:
